Trolls under the bridge, Part II:

Division of Safety of Dams limitations threaten use of Lake Hodges

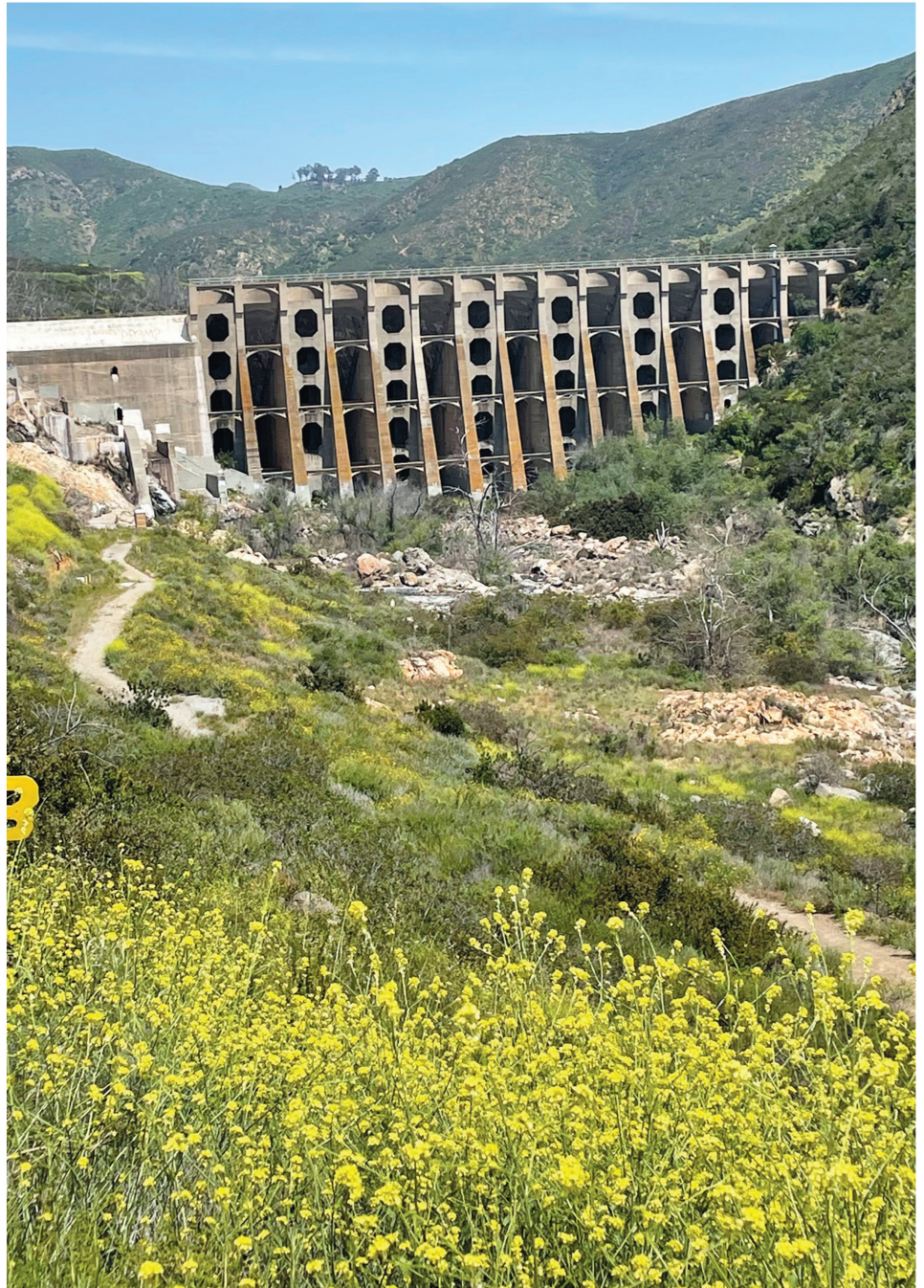
Part 2 of 2 parts, continued from last week.

In last week's installment, we talked about how the century-old Lake Hodges came to be, thanks to two historical figures, William Henshaw and Colonel Ed Fletcher, and the design of engineer John S. Eastwood. And how it was completed after 12 months of construction, in November 1918.

But the Lake Hodges dam faces "a bleak future," as Epp writes.

PLANT LIFE

The topic of plant life at Lake Hodges may invoke either images of trees growing out of a dry lake bottom, or tree tops sticking out of the water. True, but the hillsides and valleys around Lake Hodges are also dominated by a wide range of coastal sage scrub, which is mostly low growing, aromatic and generally soft-leaved shrubs with a variety of species. Higher slopes feature mixed chaparral, and there are five different species of California oak in the area which provide canopies over the trail,

particularly on the southern side abutting the lake. Sycamores are sprinkled throughout, and of course, lake bottom areas are perfect for the growth of willows.

ANIMALS

Although one can see the occasional whitetail deer browsing the underbrush, as well as the range of small animals typically found in southern California, Lake Hodges is best known for a range of birds that make it a birdwatcher's heaven.

An abundance of hawks, woodpeckers, ducks, swallows and many other birds around the lake are always fascinating to watch, but the Lake is also home to several species of the grebe, a spirited bird that one can find in abundance on Lake Hodges. The bird is popular for its elaborate mating ritual, which can involve an activity that looks much like walking on water as they rush alongside each other during the ritual.

REPAIRS AND REPLACEMENT

Beginning in early 2022, the city identified sealing and other repairs that were needed on the upper side of the dam. It's hard to work underwater, so the lake was lowered about 18 feet, to a level around 275 feet. Repair work started in May of 2022.

However, as the repair work continued, additional defects were discovered. Repairs were extended, which meant low lake levels continued. And low lake levels mean no boating or kayaking, impacts to the habitat around the lake, and even people getting stuck in the mud as they ventured into the lake bottom areas while hiking. Repairs are now expected to last well into spring of 2023. Only then was the city hoping lake levels and shorelines could be maintained with some sense of stability to allow decisions about recreational use to be made.

However, two other dynamics emerged. The first was obvious to all: a very wet winter with lots of rain. This generated a huge amount of water naturally flowing into Lake Hodges. Because the lake had to be maintained at a lower level for the repairs, this water could not be retained. This is worth noting in our region—where the price of water can command upwards of \$1,500

and community working together. So if a business owner is reluctant to take the advice we are suggesting, then the problems do seem to persist. We have seen some sections of the business community where we haven't gotten as much support from a business owner as we thought we would get, and the problem continued."

We asked, "What kind of support are you talking about?"

Varso continued, "Sometimes we will go in and make some recommendation: Trim back your bushes. Increase your lighting, maybe install a fence or install and gate. Or like at Motel 6, they had a lot of open access areas, where people could cross from other properties into Motel 6, do criminal activity and sneak away. Those owners were willing to invest some money. They put up a nice wrought iron fence around three sides and lighting. It just makes sense. Even from a common sense perspective of 'Well, if I was engaged in criminal activity what would I want?' I'd want to be able to get away from the cops really easy. I'd want to be in a place where I couldn't be seen, in the dark. If I'm homeless, I want to be able to tuck into a bush where nobody can see me. So when you can take those things away—it makes it less attractive."

Rowten pointed out that the extra costs of dealing with homelessness can put a business owner at an "unfair economic disadvantage." He said the homeless situation on property near the Chamber office required an expense, which the manager of that property said was added to his budget. "That's what he had to add to his budget that his business partner in Rancho Bernardo doesn't have to do." He noted that this situation will probably exacerbate when North County Transit builds 475 units of workforce housing on its property at Escondido's transit center.

We asked Chief Varso why he returned to Escondido after leaving the city to be chief of the Menifee Police Department for several months?

"You know, I love Escondido," replied Varso. "I made a decision that I felt was good for my family and it wasn't too long into that that I missed my team. I missed this community, I missed the work we had been doing. And I was having a conversation with our city manager and we were talking. It was always planned that I would help

him through the interview process for the next chief. And as we were talking about what would go through that, the topic came up about me coming back."

He told the city manager, "I've had times where I've thought, 'Maybe I should ask for my old job back.' That's what started the whole conversation about me coming back. Escondido is a really neat city. It has challenges, some challenging circumstances in a lot of different ways. But it also has some opportunity, and a really, really good police department, and I wanted to be part of that."

We asked what the public's reaction has been to his return?

"It's been really, really positive," said Varso. "Which is humbling for me. I think of the Chamber mixer that I went to and he introduces me and everybody is cheering and roaring and clapping. Which is humbling and tells me that I'm on the right track, because a police chief has to be mindful of the entire community perspective. I have to be mindful of those that are concerned about police, don't trust the police. And I have to be mindful of those who have concerns about public safety on a whole variety of topics. And so it does help you to know that you are on the right track and that the community does support you."

We asked Varso if it was a matter of being closer to the family?

Varso said, "We had moved down here. Most of my career we had lived in the Temecula area. And I was tired of the drive and I had convinced my wife to move back to Escondido. This was before the pandemic. Our youngest is 10, but she was doing dance classes. The pandemic happened and everything was still closed down here. And so we were attending classes up there. So it came that six days a week my wife was commuting to our daughter's dance school. And it became such a burden on my family that I needed to do the right thing as a husband and father and move my family back up there. And so we had moved back up there and that's when the offer came from Menifee. I was given the opportunity to look at that. You get lured away because at the end of the day we have people who we care about in our personal lives and I'm a husband and a father first and I got lured away—and I got lured back."

We asked Varso: "How hard is to keep crime down and enforce the laws when the laws basically say that so many things that are not crimes now used to be crimes? To the point where you can reach over a steal someone's cell phone and the police can't do much about it."

"It's very frustrating for me," said Varso. "and really frustrating for our police officers who are actually the ones going to these calls. Because, you are talking to people that are victims of crime and are hoping that the police are going to be able to help them. And you can see the frustration and anger and hurt when you are a victim of a crime and the police are telling you there isn't really much they can do about it because the laws have changed. Or I can write a person a ticket and they might go to court and that's all we can do."

He continued, "But at the same time, that doesn't mean we throw up our hands and give up. We are still going to do everything we can to intervene to the best of our abilities. A lot of our homeless population is addicted to drugs. And that drug addiction is rampant in a way that I have never seen in my career in Escondido and it's attributed to the fact that we have much more lax laws."

Chief Varso will continue discussing what the police can do in an environment where state law often discourages crime prevention.

The failures of Housing First

Why are we seeing more and more homeless people on the streets? It's a question every San Diegan is asking themselves. Despite billions of dollars being spent, why is the problem only worsening? One of the biggest reasons is the State's approach, Housing First.

Housing First prioritizes immediate, "low barrier" access to housing for those living on the streets. While this may sound like an admirable mission, the requirements for living in housing is ... nothing! There aren't any requirements for conditions or milestones such as sobriety or compliance with treatment.

This may work well for a family or individuals who have a sudden loss of income and need a place to temporarily get back on their feet. But for individuals with drug or alcohol addiction or significant mental health challenges, or (too often) all of the above, rules, support and structure are needed.

Today, nearly 1 in 3 homeless people live in California. Housing First is a significant reason why numbers have continued to rise in California. Rather than shift gears and look for a new solution, or a more complete menu of options and approaches, the State has doubled down on Housing First, despite its repeated failures. State and Federal funding comes with requirements to be

housing first only.

We have some fantastic local organizations that can truly help the homeless with treatment, services, support and housing to get them back on their feet. One such organization is Solutions for Change, a North County service provider. Unfortunately, their government funding was pulled because they would not allow people to use drugs and alcohol in their program.

The reality is that homelessness will continue to grow unless State politicians change their Housing First mindset and address the root causes such as drug and alcohol abuse and mental illness. Data shows three in four people sleeping on sidewalks or in tents under overpasses are there mainly because they suffer from drug addiction and mental illness. It's not a housing problem; it's a government problem. Politicians need to change their mindset if they genuinely want to help those suffering on the street.

Memories of Lake Hodges

Good (fill in the blank morning, afternoon or evening) as you read your hometown newspaper. In last week's T-A was a great column by Escondido's former City Attorney and City Manager Jeff Epp giving us all a good history lesson on one of Escondido's attractions although it is not within our city limits. Part 1 about the fishing and boating destination Lake Hodges. Part 2 is in today's edition.

Since he is a lawyer I thought I would have to include this disclaimer. Now I do not know what Epp's column will contain so if I duplicate something it is purely coincidental. There is no plagiarism.

That said, talk about Lake Hodges conjures up memories beginning with my first trip over the Hwy 395 bridge while on vacation here in 1972. For any newcomers, I-15 had not yet been constructed.

This was a time when SoCal was enduring another drought and the lake at that point was bone dry until just past where the current foot bridge is located. As we drove across the bridge a sign made me chuckle. The sign read, "No Fishing From Bridge." My father-in-law was driving and I said to him "did you see that sign?" and he replied that there used to be water here but it will be back again. And did the water ever come back!

In a past column I wrote about the horrendous rains that hit this area in January 1978. With kayakers riding the rapids of the San Dieguito Creek, more like a raging river then, on the west end of the lake. Epp's column reminded me about a photo, actually a not so good copy of a photo, that I had somewhere. I began looking through old files and found the photo taken by T-A photographer Dan Rios on March 5, 1978 showing the dam overflowing for the first time since 1952.

Along with that photo I had copies of a photo that Bill Cheney had in his photography studio. Ah, there's a name from the past. The photo was taken in 1945 showing the original bridge over the lake in the same location as is the footbridge today since it is the narrowest location connecting points north and south of the lake. Back then the road was but two lanes which connected to Pomerado Road in what is currently Rancho Bernardo.

When I told family we were moving to Escondido, California my aunt Angie recalled making a trip after WWII from Los Angeles to San Diego coming down the coast then going East on Mission Road from Oceanside stopping in Escondido then back to the San Diego Hwy (now Escondido Blvd) and on through Poway. This was the only road from Escondido to San Diego. I think she said the trip took about 6 hours. Remember, no I-5, no Hwy 78, no I-15.

Then in the same box I found "Escondido Vision 2005 and Community Dialogue Vision 2020." Wow! This was a gathering of community members to create a vision of what Escondido could and/or should become. I have a list of 74 names including Ed Gallo on the Steering Committee with some assigned to specific areas such as education or crime.

I'm not exactly sure what the green assignment dealt with although three people were listed for that area—which I presume meant the environment.

Most of this collection consists of discussion topics—even copies of some

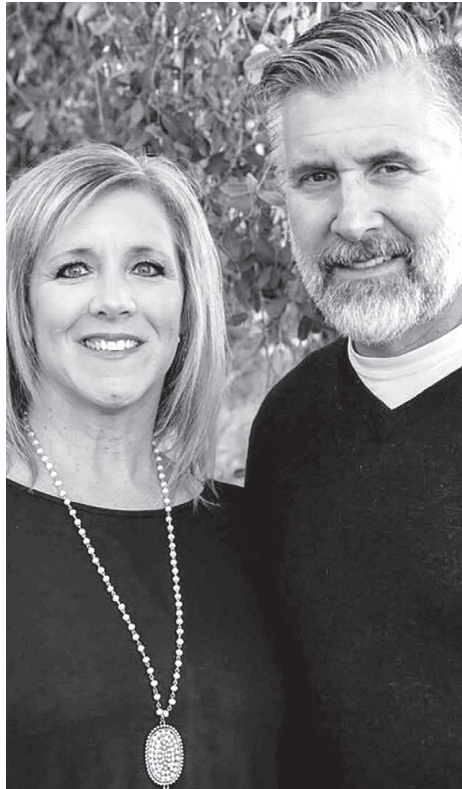
Read your Bible!

"And Jesus came and said to them, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age.'" (Matthew 28:18-20, ESV)

Have you ever seen the movie, *"I Can Do Bad All by Myself"*? (2009, The Tyler Perry Company) In it, Tyler Perry's character, Madea, strikes up a conversation with a 16-year-old girl, who also happens to be staying with her temporarily. 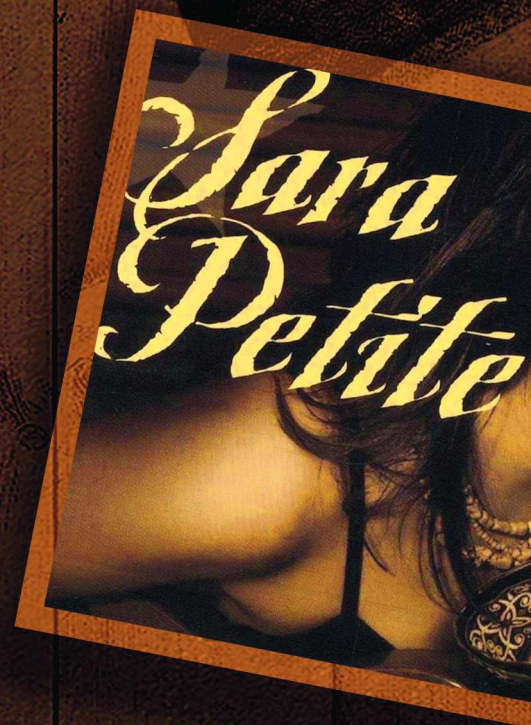

Fatal traffic collision on W. Valley Parkway

In the late evening of Sunday, May 7, the Escondido Police Department responded to a traffic collision involving a vehicle versus a pedestrian.

According to a spokesman for the Escondido Police Department, the initial officers arrived on scene and began

life saving measures. The pedestrian was transported to the hospital by ambulance but succumbed to his injuries. The collision resulted in the death of a 32- year-old Escondido resident.

A preliminary investigation has determined the pedestrian was crossing

on West Valley Parkway, outside of the marked/controlled crosswalk in the area of 9th Avenue. The pedestrian was found to be wearing dark clothing at the time of the collision.

There was no evidence of intoxication found for driver of the vehicle.
